Good afternoon

While many restrictions in our school have relaxed and normal operations are resuming, it is important we remain vigilant and ensure adequate COVID safe practices are being followed.

Face mask requirement after isolation

If your child has been in COVID quarantine or Close-Contact Isolation, masks are required to be worn for the following 7 days whilst indoors (and only if they are unable to maintain physical distancing when outdoors). There is a degree of confidentiality regarding the medical status of your child and therefore we are relying on you to ensure a mask is worn when required.

Children symptomatic at school

You will be called to collect your child immediately from school. You will be given a RAT to take home and we ask you contact the school to advise the result of that test.

Excursions and Camps

For day-excursions, if your child becomes symptomatic, they will be provided with a mask to wear and you will be contacted to collect them from that venue. You will be given a RAT at the time of pickup.

Students and staff who are participating in an overnight camp will need to show a negative RAT or PCR test taken the day before departure. If you do not have access to a RAT, one will be available for you (the parent) to collect from the school (we are not permitted to distribute the RATs to your child).

If your child becomes symptomatic while on camp, staff will follow the prearranged response that was communicated at the time of organising the camp. This may involve you being available to collect your child from a pre-arranged location. You will be given a RAT at the time of pickup. We will not be able to confirm a COVID case while on camp, as we will not COVID-test your children. Students who are considered a close-contact of any other student who reported as COVID-positive while on camp would then need to be collected by parents, to isolate for 7 days.
