Each school review generates a number of key improvement strategies to inform continuous improvement in all state schools. The next steps are...

- ➔ Review and refine behaviour management processes and approaches to provide clarity of expectations and practices, and embed consistent implementation across the school within a culture of high expectations.
- ➔ Adopt a strategic approach to reinvigorate staff understanding of, commitment to, and successful engagement with, the New Art and Science of Teaching.
- ➔ Devise and systematically implement processes that provide modelling, observation, and feedback opportunities for teachers.
- ➔ Further refine, communicate and enact a precise explicit improvement agenda to promote increased clarity, consistency and sustainability of practice with a specific focus on pedagogy and behaviour management.
- ➔ Evaluate the school's signature programs and approaches to structural differentiation to determine their impact on Year 12 and post-school outcomes for those students.
